Narrative Summary

Barry Rodrigue is an archaeologist, geographer and professor of anthropology at Symbiosis International University, Pune, Maharashtra, India. He began his career as an ethnographer and field biologist in Alaska, where he established the journal, *Archipelago*, and published cultural materials from around the North Pacific region. A Fulbright Scholar, he worked as a research geographer at Laval University in Quebec and associate professor of humanities at the University of Southern Maine. His technique of integrating local, regional, global and universal studies into a unified context made him an early advocate of micro-macro studies. A founder of the International Big History Association (IBHA), he serves as International Coordinator. He is also a founding member of the Eurasian Center for Megahistory and System Forecasting (Russian Academy of Sciences) and the Asian Big History Association, for which he is General Coordinator. His latest production is the three-volume collection, *From Big Bang to Galactic Civilizations: A Big History Anthology*, which includes articles by 100 scholars from 25 nations.
