Course Description:

Between 1200 A.D. and 1700 A.D., India was ruled by various Kings and a Queens whose religious beliefs were formed outside India. However in terms of governance of their territories there was a lot of similarity with the earlier Indian rulers. This paper seeks to understand the relationships between state and society in medieval times.

The topics covered under this course are History of Islam in India, Expansion of the Delhi Sultanate, Society and economy under the sultanate, Art and Architecture and developments in literature and Decline of the Great Mughals to name a few.
