


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FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS:




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FEEDBACK FROM TEACHERS:

Feedback was taken from both full-time faculty as well as visiting faculty. Inputs were considered on subjects to be introduced and changes to be made to existing syllabi.

The following Suggestions were made-

It was suggested that comprehensive India-focused topics be integrated into the curriculum to provide students with a deep understanding of the country's governance and international relations. Update computer science curricula to include relevant tools and application software, ensuring students gain hands-on experience. It was also suggested that a specialisation in Education be introduced. Develop and implement writing courses in Global Standard English taught by native speakers with a focus on journalistic writing to improve students' communication skills. Design courses to include more fieldwork and practical experiences, helping students apply theoretical knowledge in real-world settings.




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FEEDBACK FROM EMPLOYERS:




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FEEDBACK FROM ALUMNI:




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FEEDBACK FROM PARENTS:

The following broad feedback was received-

- 1. **Practical Exposure**: Parents appreciate the exposure given to students through assignments and projects, emphasizing its importance.
- 2. **Modern Tools**: They suggest incorporating tools like Excel, PowerPoint, Google Docs, and basic AI as learning tools.
- 3. **AI and ML Modules**: There is a push for AI-led modules and machine learning across all streams to embrace new technology.
- 4. Career counselling: A significant concern is the lack of career counselling.

Students	 Queries regarding CA & SEE details, Online platform related concerns, Concerns with regard to pedagogy Review of Faculty feedback. As per feedback most courses were not overlapping and met the learning requirements of the students. Students were explained Program outcomes and courses are relevant to industry requirements with adequate time given for learning. Feedback was largely concerning certain faculty performances which were addressed by the director through meetings held with faculty. Minor changes were suggested in certain subjects and more subjects related to AI and those that would enhance employability. It was also suggested to revise the Research Methodology course. Students have expressed worries about further education like with any other undergraduate program. 	 The Director has met with the concerned faculty members of SSLA and shared with them the feedback received from students, both through online responses, Open House Sessions and otherwise. Action has been taken in accordance with the feedback received. Where needed, faculty were addressed by the Director for mentoring in areas required based on the feedback received. Meetings were scheduled with Faculty individually along with PAR meetings. Papers on Essentials of Information Technology and Advanced Python and Data Analytics have been introduced in the 12th PRC for the upcoming batch. A paper on Career Management was introduced in the 11th PRC. Minor revisions have been carried out in the Research Methodology papers. To address concerns about further studies and make the journey more accessible for students SSLA has signed an MoU with Deakin University, Australia to offer students an Accelerated Masters.
Teachers	As per the feedback, all faculty members have enough freedom to contribute ideas on curriculum design and development to nurture the required competencies among students. Various courses were introduced based on feedback from faculty.	The following courses were included in the Programme Structure under the 12 th PRC: 1. Principles of Sociology 2. Introduction to Film Music Studies 3. Introduction to Scoring Music for Film 4. Marketing Strategies for Sustainable Long-Term Growth 5. Introduction to Forensics 6. Advanced Python and Data Analytics 7. Interactive Web Designing using JavaScript 8. Essentials of Information Technology 9. Law and Society The following courses were revised: 1. Contemporary Sociological Theories 2. Classical Sociological Theory 3. Mahabharata 4. Creative Dance as a Narrative: Uday Shankar? 5. The Poetic Body, Absurd, and the Surreal The idea of Education as a specialisation was introduced in the 12 th PRC. The 13 th PRC will address further faculty suggestions on Global Standard English and designing more practical courses.




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Employers	Employers feedback was positive overall with experts finding a good blend of theory and practical aspects in the curriculum, student knowledge, skills and values being adequate for the job market. Suggestions were given regarding collaboration with social sector and more lab-based pedagogy. Along with a few courses covering practical skills.	Courses on Web designing, Advanced Python and Data Analytics and Essentials of Information Technology have been introduced in the 12 th PRC. Laboratories have been built for Psychology, Physics, Chemistry, Microbiology, Climate and Sustainability, etc to give students more practical exposure. A Series on Navigating Career was also set up to train students in Industry requirements. The 13th PRC will address further employer suggestions on lab/practical based courses.
Alumni	Most alumni agreed that the curriculum prepared them adequately for the job roles and further education. The program is well designed and promotes student learning. The alumni also found courses to generally have relevance to societal needs and employment potential. Alumni have suggested to include courses on Psychometrics. Incorporate statistics software or programming languages for research methodology in social sciences such as psychology, sociology etc. Also revaluate core courses.	Courses on Sociology, Introduction to Forensics, etc have been introduced which are in line with Alumni feedback. A Psychology Laboratory has been set up with Statistical Software available for students to use enabling psychometric testing. Core Courses are being relooked at by faculty involved and it is in the process of getting revamped. The 13 th PRC will address further alumni suggestions.
Parents	Parents generally found that the curriculum would make their ward employable and industry-ready and that the curriculum provides a choice of courses /specialization to select. Most also found a positive change in their wards. Suggestions were given to include courses on AI and IT tools. Parents pointed out the need for career counselling.	Subjects have been introduced in IT and AI like Advanced Python and Data Analytics, Interactive Web Designing using JavaScript and Essentials of Information Technology in the 12 th PRC. A paper on Career Management was introduced in the 11 th PRC. SSLA has organised a seminar titled "Managing Your Headspace to Better Navigate Career Planning" by Dr. Zafar Iqbal. SSLA has also organised CV writing Workshops as well as a series on Navigating Careers for students to strengthen their career prospects.
